NEW ENGLAND COLLEGIATE CONFERENCE PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

BASEBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Elms College junior designated hitter/ first baseman **Justin Jacobs** (Springhill, Fla.) batted .579 (11-for-19), while chipping in nine RBI and seven runs for the Blazers. Jacobs helped his team to a 3-3 week, hitting safely in all six games, collecting multiple hits in three contests, and crushing three home runs. Jacobs helped Elms sweep NECC opponent Newbury, winning 9-4 in the opener and 6-0 in the nightcap. In the first game against the Nighthawks, he had a stellar performance going 2-for-3 while coming back in game with a home run. He slugged an amazing 1.158 and posted a .579 on-base percentage, while finishing the week with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Elms College sophomore **Matt Wood** (Feeding Hills, Mass.) tossed seven shutout innings and struck out eight batters in his first collegiate no-hitter to lead the Blazers to a 6-0 win over NECC opponent Newbury. Wood walked only two batters for a 0.00 weekly ERA.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Southern Vermont College freshman outfielder **Pat Warrington** (Folcroft, Pa.) batted .391 (9-for-23) with a two-run homer, four RBI and four runs scored as the Mountaineers finished with a 1-5 weekly mark. Warrington hit safely and scored at least one run in four out of the five contests, including three multiple-hit games. He finished with a .522 slugging percentage and a .471 on-base percentage for the week.

SOFTBALL

PLAYER OF THE WEEK – Mitchell College senior outfielder **Lindsey Donelin** (Niantic, Conn.) batted .500 (14-for-28) with nine RBI and seven runs as the Mariners posted 7-1 weekly NECC only performance. In addition to a .571 slugging percentage for the week, she added two doubles and three stolen bases. Donelin hit safely in all but one contest, including five multiple-hit games. She did not strikeout in 28 trips to the plate, finishing off the week with a .563 on-base percentage and a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage

PITCHER OF THE WEEK – Mitchell College freshman **Kristina Torres** (Groton, Conn.) posted a 3-1 record with a 0.61 ERA in four complete game starts for the week. She hurled three shutout victories against NECC opponents Wheelock (2-0), Southern Vermont (14-0) and Becker (10-0) while giving up only four runs, only two of which were earned in a tough 4-3 loss against Bay Path. Torres fanned 39 batters while walking only four on the week.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK – Elms College freshman pitcher and first baseman **Courtney Hampton** (Westfield, Mass.) led the Blazers to a 6-2 weekly performance. Hampton topped the Blazers with a .478 batting average (11-for-23) with two RBI and seven runs scored. Hampton hit safely in all contests, slugging .478 for the week. In the circle, she posted her first collegiate career, three win pitching week for the Blazers. Hampton concluded her 22.0 innings hurled with a 0.32 ERA allowing six runs on 21 hits, only one earned run while fanning 30 batters.
